To this fund the Students of Medicine Surgery and Anatomy do not contribute, but pay 4/2^d each Monthly to the respective Professors.</p> <p>These Schools were established ten Years ago, during which period, there have been admitted 1088 Males and 893. females. The Children generally are taught reading, writing & Arithmetic; the English and Italian Languages, - The females all sorts of Needle Work.</p> <p>In the Seminary the Pupils are divided into two Classes, the 1st called Alunni pay £ 5. per Annum, and the 2^d called Conventori pay £ 12. 10. per Annum. They as well as the Professors &c. live in and are fed by the Establishment. The Seminary, independent of the Contributions by the Pupils has an Annual Revenue received from Landed Property of about £ 310.</p> <p>The Children are taught reading and writing, and the Rudiments of Italian Grammar.</p>
