260	1	6 $\frac{1}{2}$	817	15	4 $\frac{1}{2}$	In the Duty on Transfers of Landed Property, from a new enactment made on the 25 <sup>th</sup> May 1830, rendering the duty payable before the stipulation of the deed of transfer: in the Consumption Duties, from the cheaper price of wheat, effecting a higher rate of duty on the graduated scale as otherwise there would have been a decrease, in about the proportion resulting from the Petty Duty on Wheat and Flour: - in the Notarial Duty, from a more efficient collection of arrears: - and in the Charitable Institutions, chiefly from the recovery of savings made in the fund allotted for the Charities of the Island of Gozo. For the improvement in the Excise on Wine and Spirits, no cause can be assigned the consumption of these Articles having increased while that of other Articles of Import has diminished.
