CONDITION of Furniture in the Official Residences of His Excellency the Governor.

Three Buildings are set apart for the use of the Governor,—one in the City of Valletta,—another at a Village distant about four miles from Town called "St. Antonio Palace"—and the third one is Fort Verdala about eight miles distant from the City and occupied as a summer residence.

PALACE, VALLETTA.

The Palace in Valletta built in the year 1572, is a square building covering an area of about two acres—to be kept in a good state of repair from the public funds. One of the Halls in the upper story of this Building is appropriated as a Council Room; and the apartments, independently of the State rooms the Ancient Armoury and the Office of the Governor and his Private Secretary, form the residence of His Excellency the Governor.

Into the basement story have been removed the Offices of the Military Secretary, the Chief Secretary to Government, the Collector of Land Revenue, the Comptroller of Charitable Institutions, the Offices of Hypothecations, the Archives, the Treasury, the Printing Office, and that of the Crown Advocate, and of the Superintendant of Police.

PALACE OF St. ANTONIO.

The Palace of St. Antonio built in about 1630 is now unused, in consequence of its great heat as a residence,—it has a garden attached to it containing about eleven acres of land, kept in a good state of repair from public funds. The gardens are a place of public resort, their vicinity to the Town offering an agreeable walk to the inhabitants of Valletta.

*N.B. These Buildings, formerly the residence of the Grand Masters, contained valuable furniture, and several paintings, some of which have disappeared;—and the remainder, being much deteriorated from decay, requiring to be replaced, a sum of £1400. . . has been expended during the years 1866 and 1867 towards the renewal & restoring of a portion of the same; the

Completion of these works will be continued during 1868. and in subsequent years, as recommended by a Special Committee in their Report dated 30th May, 1866.

Fort Verdala.

The House is only partially furnished and during the Summer months, when it is occasionally occupied by the Governor, additional furniture from the Palace of Valletta is removed into it. - The gardens and lands attached, are also, like St. Antants gardens, a place of Public resort. - Much requires to be done to bring them to a proper condition.
