MODE OF ELECTION, *Vice Ordinance No. 1 of 1861.*

A list, subject to revision, of persons deemed qualified to vote for the election of Members to serve in the Council of Government is published in the Government Gazette. A Court of Revision composed of two Magistrates holds sittings to receive claims, consider objections &c. which must be made within 10 days of the date of the Government Notice notifying the Election. A rectified list of persons entitled to vote is then again published in the Gazette. The Head of the Government appoints by a Notice in the Government Gazette not less than three Commissioners to conduct the election. The said Commissioners prepare, and cause to be delivered to each elector, certificates declaring said elector entitled to vote. A Government Notice is published fixing the days and places of the election and appointing the Assistant Commissioners. On presentation at the appointed places of the said certificate by the Elector therein mentioned, he is provided by the Assistant Commissioner with a ticket on which he writes the names of the persons for whom he votes.

At a GENERAL election for MALTA each elector has the right of naming four persons for whom he votes.
