Official Residences of His Excellency the Governor.

Three Buildings are set apart for the use of the Governor,— one in the city of Valletta,— another at a village distant about four miles from Valletta, called “ St. Antonio Palace ”— and the third one is “ Verdala Palace,” about eight miles distant from the city, and occupied as a summer residence.

PALACE, VALLETTA.

The Palace in Valletta, built in the year 1572, is a square building, covering an area of about two acres, to be kept in a good state of repair from the public funds. One of the halls in the upper story of this building is appropriated as the Council Room; and the apartments, independently of the State Rooms, the Ancient Armoury, and the Office of the Governor, form the residence of His Excellency the Governor.

The basement story is occupied by the Offices of the Chief Secretary to Government, the Cashier of the Treasury, the Collector of Land Revenue, the Comptroller of Charitable Institutions, the Superintendent of the Printing Office, the Government Press, the Registrar of the Public Registry, the Crown Advocate, and by that of the Assistant Military Secretary.

PALACE “ St ANTONIO.”

The Palace of St. Antonio, built in about 1630, is now unused, in consequence of its great heat as a residence; it has a garden attached to it containing about eleven acres of land, and is kept in a good state of repair from the public funds. The gardens are a place of public resort, their vicinity to the town offering an agreeable walk to the inhabitants of Valletta.

N.B.— The above-mentioned Buildings, formerly the residence of the Grand Masters, contained valuable furniture, and several paintings, some of which have disappeared, and the remainder, being much deteriorated from decay, and requiring to be replaced, a sum of £ 5,346 4 was expended during the years 1866 to 1878, towards restoring and renewing a portion thereof.

PALACE “ VERDALA ”

The house is only partially furnished, and during the summer months, when it is occasionally occupied by the Governor, additional furniture from the Palace of Valletta is removed into it. The gardens and lands attached are also, like St. Antonio Gardens, a place of public resort. Much requires to be done to bring them into a proper condition.

REMARKS ON SQUATTING.

There is no squatting in these Islands.
