Instructions of 1847.

Revenue, General Causes of Increases or Decreases, above £ 100

A (*Imports, Tonnage Dues* — and *Store-Rent*) have given increases for the following reasons: —
Imports — in the greater part, “to consumption operations” of unusual magnitude, consequent upon favourable local circumstances, and prices of the Wheat Market.

Tonnage Dues — to the increased influx of shipping owing to the re-opening of the Russian Ports in the Black Sea.

Store-Rent — chiefly to the settlement of an amount of arrear Store-Rent on Olive Oil which had been for years under sequestration.

B These receipts always vary according to circumstances.

STATEMENT OF THE EXPENDITURE OF 1878.

Instructions of 1847.

Expenditure, General Causes of Increases or Decreases, above £ 100

- A** This difference is caused by savings on certain salaries made in 1877.
- B** The annual rate of pensions granted in 1878 amounted to £ 1,289 15 1; that of pensions lapsed in 1878 amounted to £ 474 10 2.
From 1st April 1875 all military pensions ceased to be payable by the local Government.
- C** This difference is spread over several items.
- D** The differences are chiefly on items for provisions and medicines.
- E** This increase is chiefly on items for provisions to Corradino Prison, and incidental expenses for Police, and Sanitary purposes.
- F** The difference is caused in consequence of the second weekly service between Malta and Sicily.
- G** These differences depend simply on the services undertaken and the coast. The sums revoted for 1879 are, Works and Buildings £ 2,278 11; Roads &c. £ 1,616 7 4.
- H** These services depend upon the special requirements of each year, and fluctuate accordingly.
- I** The total decrease was £ 1,574 19 5.
