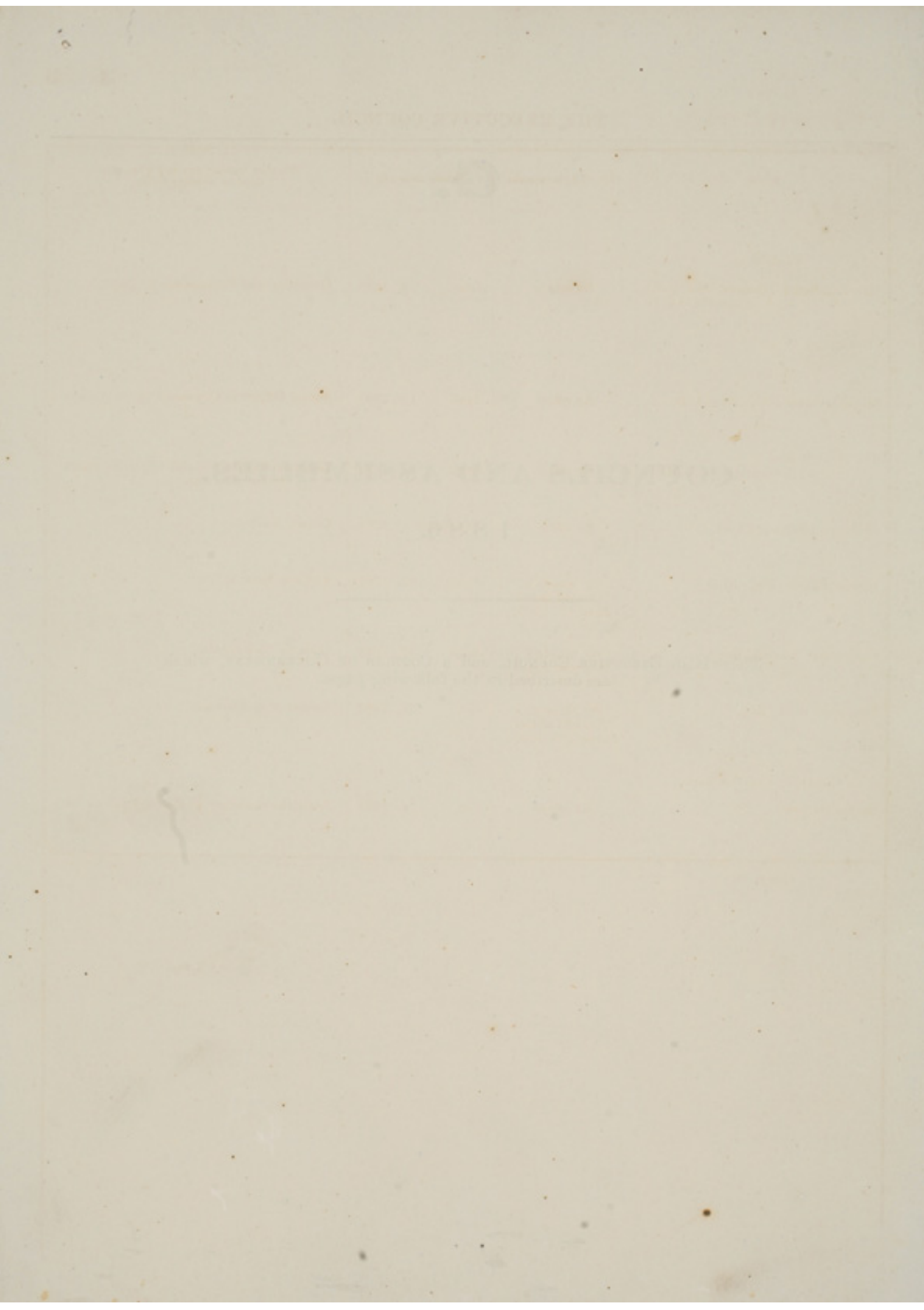

Sections I, II, of Letters Patent dated March 2, 1883.

I. No person shall be qualified to be elected a Member of the said Council of Government if he has at any time been convicted of treason or any infamous crime, nor unless,

(1) he possesses immoveable property situate in Malta or its Dependencies of the clear value of one hundred pounds sterling money above all charges and encumbrances affecting the same, and has possessed immoveable property in Malta or its Dependencies to that value for at least twelve calendar months next before the election; or

(2) rents immoveable property situate in Malta or its Dependencies of the yearly value of ten pounds sterling money, and has rented property in Malta or its Dependencies, to that value for at least twelve calendar months before the election; or

(3) being the occupant of any room or lodging in Malta or its Dependencies, has paid for his board and lodging at least forty pounds sterling money yearly, or for his lodging only at the rate of at least ten pounds sterling money yearly, and has continuously paid such amount for board and lodging, or for lodging only for at least twelve calendar months before the election.

nor unless, besides possessing some one of the foregoing qualifications, he has not for at least five years before the election been in receipt of any charitable relief from public sources.

II. If any person hereby declared to be disqualified for being elected a Member of the said Council shall nevertheless be elected, his election shall be void, and the Council may declare his place in the said Council to be vacant, and thereupon another person shall forthwith be elected in his stead; and if any such person shall sit or vote in the Council as an elected Member, he shall, for every day on which he sits or votes, forfeit the sum of fifty pounds sterling money, to be recovered by action in the First Hall of Her Majesty's Civil Court by any person who shall sue for the same.
