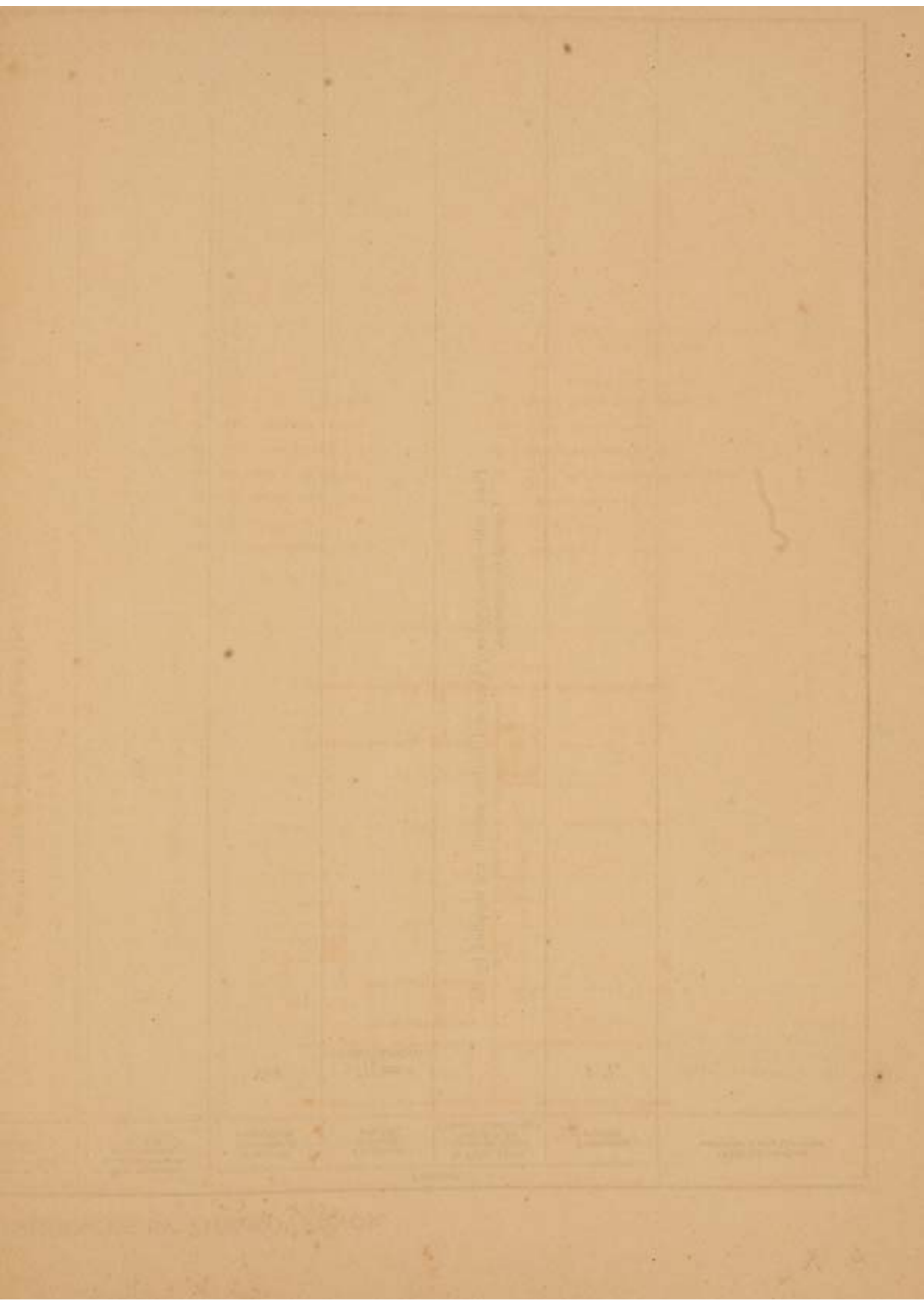

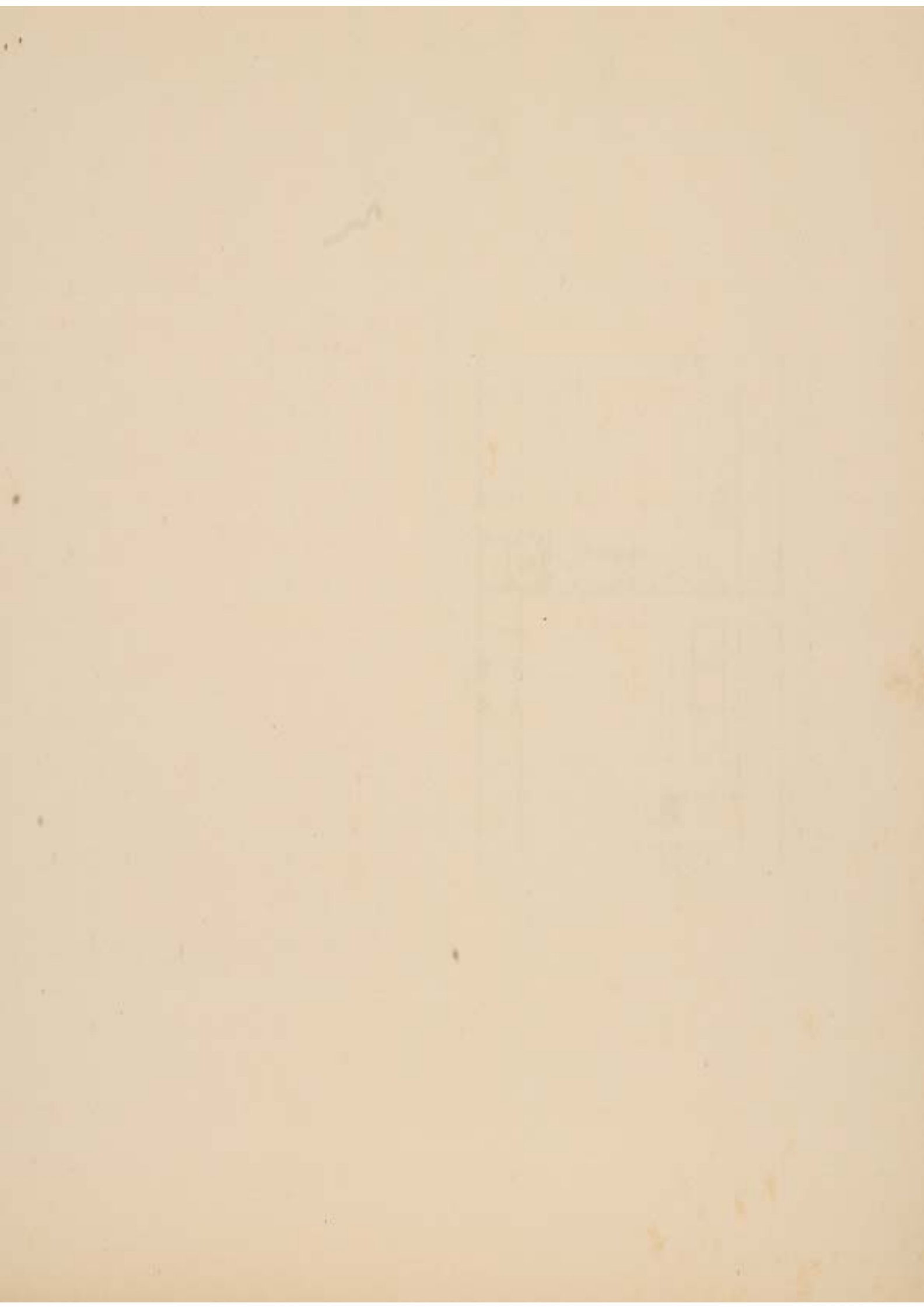

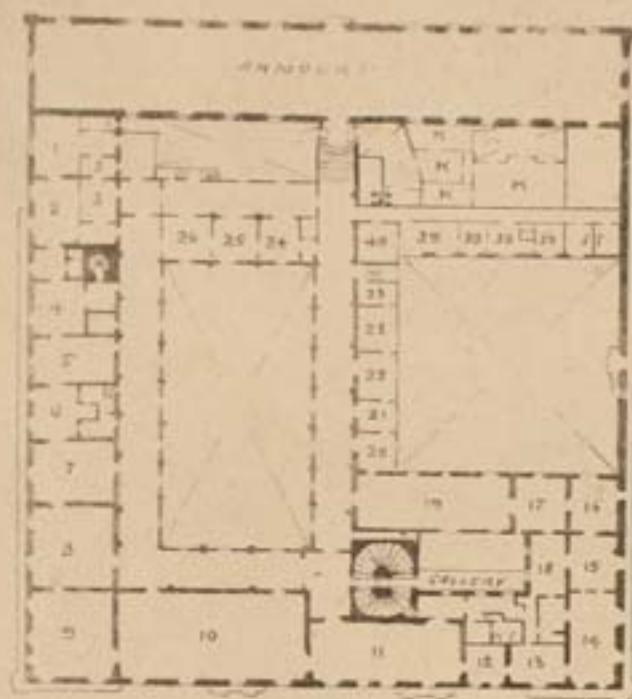


GOVERNOR'S PALACE - VALLETTA

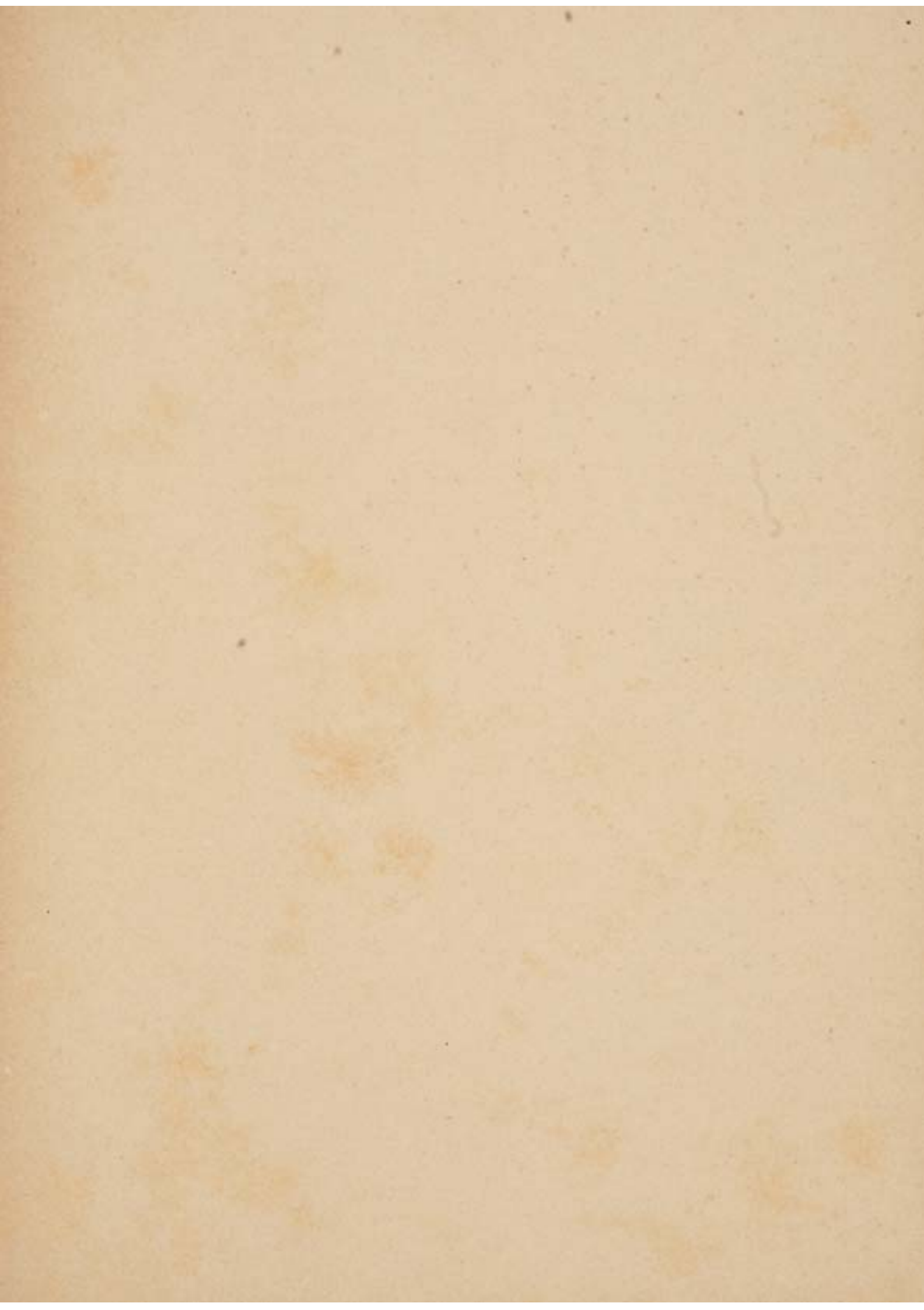

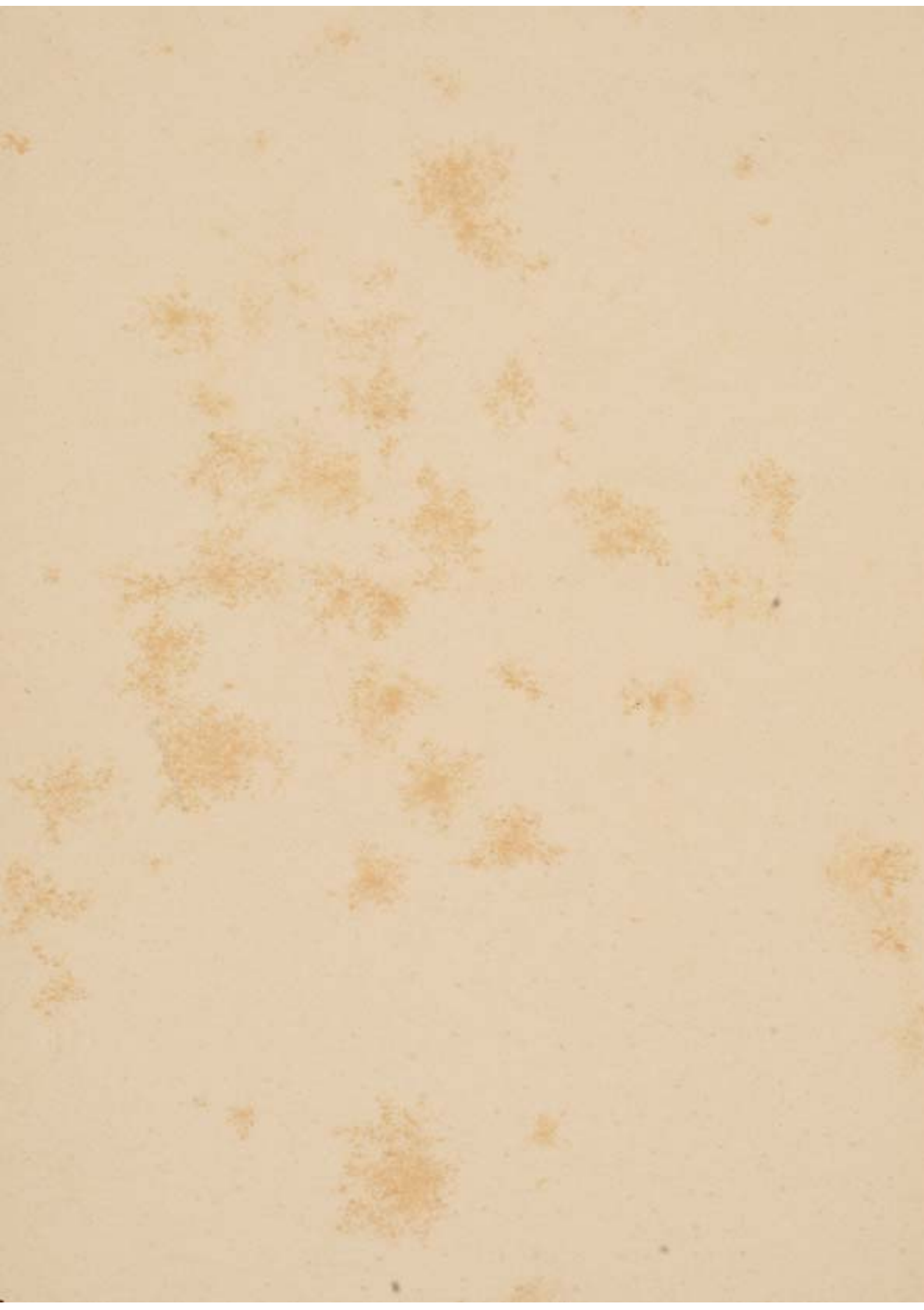
