113	...	For Orphans of both sexes between the age of 6 and 16. With few exceptions, the children have lost both parents. The building was formerly the Hospital for Men.
3475	...	This Institution is for the reception of Male and Female patients, and contains 200 beds.
87
128	...	This Hospital, which was opened on the 20th March 1882, adjoins the Central Hospital, and contains 26 beds intended only for seamen, who contribute 2/6 per day each for their maintenance and treatment.
540	...	Hospital for infectious diseases.
38	...	Enlarged in 1850. Capable of containing 72 patients—42 Males and 30 Females. This Hospital is partly used for convalescent patients from the Central Hospital.
868	...	This Hospital, which was equipped at the expense of His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught, was formally opened by His Majesty the King, on the 22nd April 1900. It contains 70 beds, and is principally intended for cases of Phthisis.
1139	...	Hospital for mental disorders. The building is situated at <i>Wied Isotta</i> , between Notabile and Attard. It was opened on the 16th of July 1861, on which day the patients were transferred thereto from the Asylum at Floriana.
67	...	For the reception of the aged and disabled poor, above the age of 60, and of persons affected with incurable diseases, of both sexes; women who have led a dissolute life and are anxious to repent; and foundling and deserted infants until nurses can be found for them in the country, or they become of age to be admitted into the Orphan Asylum.
621	...	A portion of the building has this year been filled up as a Hospital for Venereal Diseases, which were hitherto treated at the Central Hospital.
197	...	For Male Lepers. The law is not yet applied to Female Lepers, for want of the necessary accommodation, which is, however, now being provided.
17	...	For both sexes, and capable of containing 60 patients.
	...	Accommodates 160 aged and disabled poor (80 of each sex) above 60 years of age, with few exceptions, there being no Institutions for incurable cases in Gozo.
	...	Hospital for contagious diseases.

The number of children farmed out during the above period was 664 in Malta and 14 in Gozo. Monthly average 234 in Malta at the rate of about 1/6 each, and 5 in Gozo at the rate of 4/- each.

Gratuitous assistance of a Midwife was given in 401 cases, monthly average 33, at the rate of about 4/3 each in Malta; and in 41 cases in Gozo, monthly average 3, at the rate of 7/3 each including travelling expenses.
