LITERARY INSTITUTIONS.

No. of inmates in 1911-1912	How supported	REMARKS
128	...	For Orphans of both sexes between the age of 6 and 16. With few exceptions, the children have lost both parents. The building was formerly the Hospital for Men.
3917	...	This Institution is for the reception of Male and Female patients; and since the Seamen's Hospital formerly attached to it was removed to the Zammit Clapp Hospital at St. Julian's on 29th August 1911, it contains 230 beds.
44	...	This Hospital, which was opened on the 20th March 1882, was closed on 29th August 1911 and transferred to the Zammit Clapp Hospital at St. Julian's. The premises were added to the Central Hospital.
175	...	Hospital for infectious diseases.
50	...	Opened on 29th August 1911 in the premises of the Zammit Clapp Hospital. Capable of containing 13 beds intended only for seamen, who contribute 2/6 per day each for their maintenance and treatment.
603	...	Enlarged in 1850. Capable of containing 72 patients—42 Males and 30 Females. This Hospital is partly used for convalescent patients from the Central Hospital.
417	...	This Hospital, which was equipped at the expense of His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught, was formally opened by His Majesty the King, on the 22nd April 1909. It contains 95 beds, and is principally intended for cases of Phthisis.
882	...	Hospital for mental disorders. The building is situated at <i>Wied Jucita</i> , between Notabile and Attard. It was opened on the 16th of July 1861, on which day the patients were transferred thereto from the Asylum at Floriana.
1199	...	For the reception of the aged and disabled poor, above the age of 60, and of persons affected with incurable diseases, of both sexes; women who have led a dissolute life and are anxious to repent; and foundling and deserted infants until nurses can be found for them in the country, or they become of age to be admitted into the Orphan Asylum. A portion of the building is fitted up as a Hospital for women suffering from Venereal Diseases.
68	...	For Male Lepers. The law will soon be applied to Female Lepers, the necessary accommodation having been provided.
646	...	For both sexes, and capable of containing 60 patients.
187	...	Accommodates 160 aged and disabled poor (50 of each sex) above 60 years of age, with few exceptions, there being no Institution for incurable cases in Gozo.
8	...	Hospital for contagious diseases.

The number of children farmed out during the above period was 607 in Malta and 16 in Gozo. Monthly average 238 in Malta at the rate of about 3/6 each, and 4 in Gozo at the rate of 4/9½ each.

Gratuitous assistance of a Midwife was given in 338 cases, monthly average 28, at the rate of about 4/2½ each in Malta; and in 28 cases in Gozo, monthly average 2, at the rate of 6/4½ each including travelling expenses.
