<p>Under clause 18 of the Letters Patent of the 3rd June 1903, every male person is entitled to be registered as an elector, and when registered to vote at the election of a member of the Council, who has attained the age of twenty-one years, and is a British subject by birth or naturalization, and</p> <p>(1) is qualified by law in Malta and its Dependencies to serve as a common juror, whether he is or is not exempted by age, office, or profession from the obligation of serving as a juror; or</p> <p>(2) is paying and has paid, for six months next before registration, rent for immovable property in Malta at the rate of at least six pounds by the year; or</p> <p>(3) is, in his own right or in right of his wife, in receipt from immovable property in Malta of a clear income of at least six pounds in the year, and has been entitled to such income for six months next before registration.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>I District</b></p> <p>East Valletta.</p>	One	1,133
