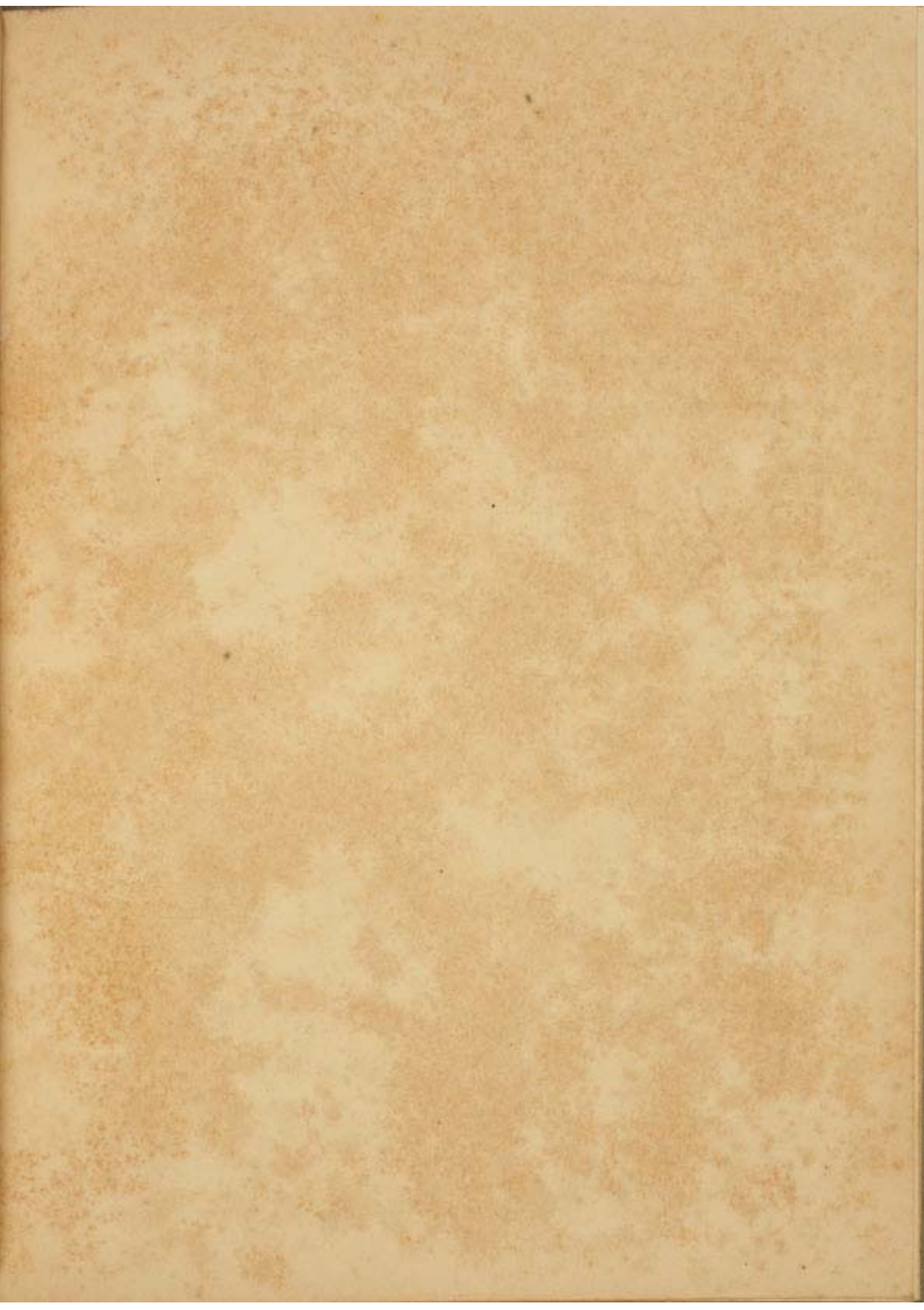

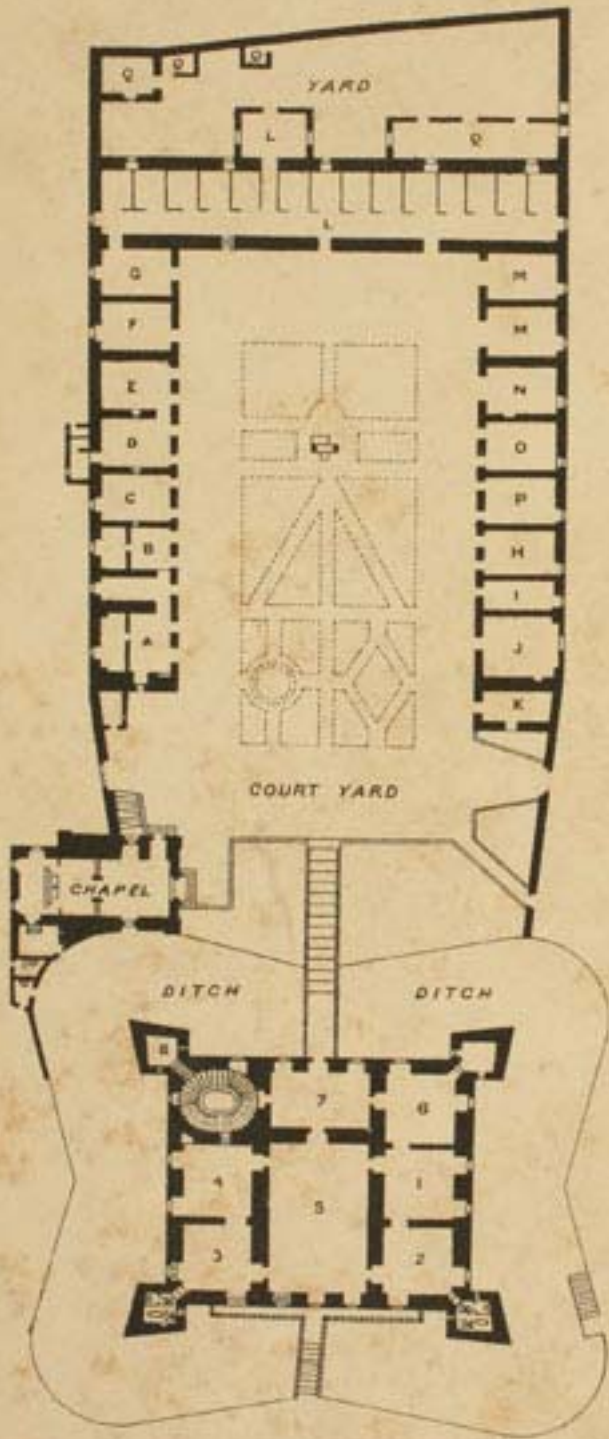

GROUND FLOOR PLAN.

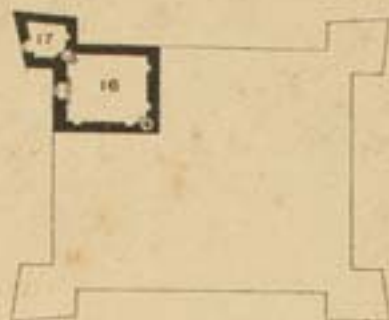


FIRST FLOOR PLAN.
