TECHNICAL EDUCATION.

There are 22 technical evening classes in the Elementary Schools' Department with an average attendance of 988 pupils. Marine and Electrical Engineering Classes are held in the Lyceum with a workshop for practical training attached to the Malta Railway. The attendance in 1922-23 was 95 students. Students attend H.M. Dockyard for practical instruction. Carpentry is taught at the Reformatory to boys. Technical Education cost the Government £ 1,052 in 1922-23. There are two other private technical institutes, viz: the Salesian Industrial School and the Istituto Vincenzo Bugeja, the former of which is subsidized by the Government.
