TECHNICAL EDUCATION.

There are 25 technical evening and day classes (drawing and modelling) in the Elementary Schools' Department with an average attendance of 1,169 pupils. Marine and Electrical Engineering Classes are held in the Lyceum with a workshop for practical training attached to the Malta Railway. The attendance in 1927-28 was 66 students. The cost was £303. 4. 7. Students attend H.M. Dockyard for practical instruction. Carpentry, shoemaking, stone-cutting and trimming are taught at the Salvatore Reformatory. Technical Education cost the Government £1,427 in 1927-28. There are other private technical institutes, viz: the Salesian Industrial School, the Istituto Vincenzo Bugeja, the Casa di S. Giuseppe or Istituto Bonnici and the Oratorio San Luigi, the first three of which are subsidized by the Government.

There is also a School of Art which comprises free courses in higher art education. As at present constituted, it embraces drawing, modelling, ceramics, and history of art and general art knowledge.

A Migrants Training Centre was opened in February 1928 and the expenditure on this service during 1927-28 amounted to £426.
