(Bachelor of Science), (3) B.Eng. & Arch. (Bachelor of Engineering and Architecture); (4) B.L.Com. (Bachelor of Canon Law); (5) M.D. (Doctor of Medicine); (6) LL.D. (Doctor of Laws); (7) D.D. (Doctor of Theology); and Diplomas of (1) Pharmacist, (2) Legal Procurator, (3) Notary Public, (4) Dental Surgeon, (5) Practical Midwife.</p> <p>The University comprises six Faculties, viz:—Literature, Science, Engineering & Architecture, Medicine & Surgery, Laws and Theology.</p> <p>(2) The Lyceum is an Institution intended to impart intermediate instruction. It is divided into two courses of studies, the Classical and the Modern, each consisting of two grades of instruction, a Higher and a Lower. It prepares young men to matriculate for admission into the University, to enter the Civil Service or to embrace the career of Commerce, Electrical Engineering and of Marine Engineering. The average annual cost for each student was £13. 4. 2.</p> <p>(3) In the Secondary School for Girls, Valletta, instruction is imparted in English, Italian, French, Arithmetic and Mathematics, Needlework and the other subjects usually included in the curriculum of a Secondary School for young ladies. The average annual cost for each student was £4. 13. 4.</p> <p>(4) In the Secondary School for Boys at Gozo, Latin, English, Italian, Arithmetic, Algebra and Geometry, History and Geography, Writing, Sacred History and Religious Doctrine are taught. It prepares young men to matriculate for admission into the University. The average annual cost for each student was £11. 6. 0.</p> <p>The Government Elementary Schools have classes for training teachers for Elementary Schools.</p> <p>The average annual cost of each student was £3. 17. 6.</p> <p>(5) The Aided Private Schools in Malta and Gozo are the following:—Wind Ghuzuzza (£30), Pinar School (£30), Marcelline School (£50), Stella Maris College (£150), Bahar-Id-Dah (£24), Wenz—one (£57), Miss Cla. TECHNICAL EDUCATION.

There are 25 technical evening and day classes (drawing and modelling) in the Elementary Schools' Department with an average attendance of 1,293 pupils. Marine and Electrical Engineering Classes are held in the Lyceum with a workshop for practical training attached to the Malta Railway. The attendance in 1928-29 was 63 students. The cost was £ 318. 5. 11. Students attend H.M. Dockyard for practical instruction. Carpentry, shoemaking, stone-cutting and trimming are taught at the Salvatore Reformatory. Technical Education cost the Government £ 2,017 in 1928-29. There are other private technical institutes, viz: the Salesian Industrial School, the Istituto Vincenzo Bugeja, the Casa di S. Giuseppe or Istituto Bonnici and the Oratorio San Luigi, the first three of which are subsidized by the Government.

There is also a School of Art which comprises free courses in higher art education. As at present constituted, it embraces drawing, modelling, ceramics, and history of art and general art knowledge.

Besides, a Migrants Training Centre at Hamrun where prospective migrants are taught colloquial English, rough carpentry, bricklaying, reinforced concrete construction, erection of building, scaffolding, bush and garden fencing and general knowledge which is considered necessary to prepare unskilled Maltese Labour to be prepared under foreign labour conditions to work efficiently in any country. The cost of running the Migrants' Training Centre amounted to £ 1398. 19. 11.
