The Lycæum is an institution intended to impart intermediate instruction. It is divided into two courses of studies, the Classical and the Modern, each consisting of two grades of instruction, a Higher and a Lower. It prepares young men to matriculate for admission into the University, to enter the Civil Service or to embrace the career of Commerce, Electrical Engineering and of Marine Engineering. The average annual cost for each student was £10. 4. 0.</p> <p>(4). In the Secondary School for Girls, Valletta, instruction is imparted in English, Italian, French, Arithmetic and Mathematics, Needlework and the other subjects usually included in the curriculum of a Secondary School for young ladies. The average annual cost for each student was £3. 10. 0.</p> <p>(5). In the Goro Lycæum, Latin, English, Italian, Arithmetic, Algebra and Geometry, History and Geography, Physics, Sacred History and Religious Doctrine are taught. It prepares young men to matriculate for admission into the University. TECHNICAL EDUCATION.

Drawing forms part of the syllabus of both the Central and the Elementary Schools, and it is taught in all the Central Schools of Malta and Gozo, and, with very few exceptions, in all the boys' elementary schools in Malta, with a standard above the third. In Gozo, it is taught at Victoria, Kirċem, and Xewkija, where the girls are also taught Drawing. Handwork is taught in all the Girls' Schools and in ten Boys' Schools.

There is also a Night School of Drawing at Notabile and a Modelling class at Tarxien.

In April, 1932, a Technical School was started at Imriehel. Woodwork and Metalwork are taught therein, besides Science, Drawing and the usual literary subjects.

There is also a Housecraft School for girls at Floriana, where pupils attend in turns. To this school are attached classes in Needlework and Cookery. Marine and Electrical Engineering Classes are held in the Lyceum. Students attend H.M. Dockyard and the Engineering Training workshop at Hamrun for practical instruction. Apprentices are trained at the Engineering Training Workshop, formerly the Railway Works, where new construction is in progress for further development of the works, and work is done for other Departments. Carpentry, shoemaking, stone-cutting and trimming, motor mechanics and driving, cooking, white and colour washing, painting and stencilling, cement paving and hair-cutting are taught at the Salvatore Reformatory. There are also private Trade Schools in Malta, viz: the Salesian Industrial School, the Istituto Vincenzo Bugeja, the Casa di S. Giuseppe or Istituto Bonnici and the Istituto d'Arti e Mestieri, the first three of which are subsidized by the Government.

There is also a School of Art which comprises free courses in higher art education. It embraces painting, drawing, modelling, history of art and general art knowledge, engraving and silversmithing.
