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Labour market

Gainfully Occupied Population: December 2004

Full-time Employment

The number of full-time gainfully occupied persons in December 2004 dropped by 253 from the preceding month, but increased by 370 persons when compared to December 2003. Hence, the full-time gainfully occupied population stood at 137,149 in the month under review..

In December 2004, employment in the private direct production sector decreased by 132 persons in comparison to November 2004. In relation to the same month in the previous year, the number of the full-time gainfully occupied persons in the private direct production sector dropped by 39 persons.

Employment in the private market services sector dropped by 82 persons in December 2004 when compared to November 2004. Over a period of twelve months, the number of the full-time gainfully occupied persons in the private market services sector increased by 1,543.

On the other hand, in December 2004, a drop of 1,080 employees in the public sector was recorded when comparing to employment in the same sector in December 2003.

Part-time Employment

In December 2004, there were 20,656 persons holding a part-time employment as their primary occupation. On the other hand, there were 16,283 persons who held a part-time job in addition to their full-time employment in December 2004. This results in a total of 36,939 part-time jobs in the labour market.

Registered Unemployed

In December 2004, there were 8,103 registered unemployed with the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC) ■

- 3 Full / part-time status is defined by what the employer (employer or self-employed) declares in the Engagement Form which is required to be sent to the ETC upon the commencement of employment.

Definitions

Part 1 of the unemployment register: Those registering under Part 1 are either new job seekers who have left school, re-entrants into the labour market, and job losers who have been made redundant by their former employer.

Part 2 of the unemployment register: Those registering under Part 2 are either workers who have been dismissed from work due to disciplinary action, left work out of their own free will, refused work or training opportunities or were struck off the register after an inspection by the Law Enforcement personnel.
