## Labour Market

### Gainfully Occupied Population: April 2006

*Administrative labour market data indicates that in April 2006, the gainfully occupied population increased by 722 persons while unemployment dropped by 179 persons compared to the same month of last year.*

Labour market data for April 2006 provided by the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC) indicate that the labour supply increased by 543 persons over the same month in the preceding year. The gainfully occupied population rose by 722 persons, whereas the registered unemployed decreased by 179 persons.

Among the sectors that accounted for the increase in employment in April 2006, the principal ones were construction, real estate, renting and business activities, and other community, social and personal service activities. Sectors registering drops in employment included manufacturing and agriculture. The drop in manufacturing employment concerned mainly the production of textiles, wearing apparel, leather goods and footwear, while employment in the manufacture of radio, television and communication equipment and apparatus increased as shown in Table 1.

Full-time employment in the private sector increased by 1.8 per cent between April 2005 and the same month last year as shown in Table 2, while there was a net drop in full-time employment within the public sector of 2.0 per cent.

According to administrative sources, total part-time employment rose by 3,281 persons between April 2005 and April 2006, mainly on account of activity in the wholesale and retail trades, hotels and restaurants and other business services ■

## **Methodological Notes**

1. In line with international methodology, annual data are being presented as an average for each respective year.
2. The statistics in this release are based on the administrative records of the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC).
3. The data in this release are to be considered as current and therefore subject to revision. Monthly data are revised in T+12.
4. Full / part-time status is defined by what the employer (employer or self-employed) declares in the Engagement Form which is required to be sent to the ETC upon the commencement of employment.

## **Definitions**

**Part 1 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 1 are either new job seekers who have left school, re-entrants into the labour market, and job losers who have been made redundant by their former employer.

**Part 2 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 2 are either workers who have been dismissed from work due to disciplinary action, left work out of their own free will, refused work or training opportunities or were struck off the register after an inspection by the Law Enforcement personnel.

**Apprentices, trainees and students:** Includes apprentices, trainees, Junior College and University students on the summer work-phase, undergraduate trainees, and trainees with fixed contracts.
