## Labour Market

### Gainfully Occupied Population: June 2006

*Administrative labour market data indicate that in June 2006, the gainfully occupied population increased by 621 persons while unemployment increased by 131 persons compared to the same month of last year.*

Labour market data for June 2006 provided by the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC) indicate that the labour supply increased by 752 persons over the same month in the preceding year. The gainfully occupied population rose by 621 persons, whereas the registered unemployed increased by 131 persons.

### Full-time Employment

Among the sectors that accounted for the increase in employment in June 2006, the principal ones were other business activities [NACE 74], construction [NACE 45] and manufacture of electronic components [NACE 32]. Sectors registering drops in employment included manufacture of textiles [NACE 17], collection and treatment of other waste [NACE 90] and manufacture of clothing [NACE 18].

Full-time employment in the private sector increased by 3.2 per cent between June 2005 and the same month this year as shown in Table 2, while there was a net drop in full-time employment within the public sector of 5.1 per cent. These developments in part reflected a shift in the categorisation of employment following a privatisation exercise.

### Part-time Employment

According to administrative sources, total part-time employment rose by 2,982 persons between June 2005 and June 2006, as shown in Table 3. This increase occurred mainly on account of activity in the real estate, renting and business activities [NACE 70 74], wholesale and retail trade [NACE 50-52], and hotels and restaurants [NACE 55].

### Apprentices, trainees and students

In June 2006, the number of apprentices, students and trainees dropped by 40.0 per cent. This can be seen in Table 1 ■

## **Methodological Notes**

1. In line with international methodology, annual data are being presented as an average for each respective year.
2. The statistics in this release are based on the administrative records of the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC).
3. The data in this release are to be considered as current and therefore subject to revision. Monthly data are revised in T+12.
4. Full / part-time status is defined by what the employer (employer or self-employed) declares in the Engagement Form which is required to be sent to the ETC upon the commencement of employment.

## **Definitions**

**Part 1 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 1 are either new job seekers who have left school, re-entrants into the labour market, and job losers who have been made redundant by their former employer.

**Part 2 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 2 are either workers who have been dismissed from work due to disciplinary action, left work out of their own free will, refused work or training opportunities or were struck off the register after an inspection by the Law Enforcement personnel.

**Apprentices, trainees and students:** Includes apprentices, trainees, Junior College and University students on the summer work-phase, undergraduate trainees, and trainees with fixed contracts.
