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Labour Market

Gainfully Occupied Population: July 2006

Administrative labour market data indicate that in July 2006, the gainfully occupied population increased by 424 persons while unemployment decreased by 11 persons compared to the same month of last year.

Labour market data for July 2006 provided by the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC) indicate that the labour supply increased by 413 persons over the same month in the preceding year. The gainfully occupied population rose by 424 persons, whereas the registered unemployed decreased by 11 persons.

Full-time Employment

A comparison between the data for July 2005 and July 2006 indicates that, among the sectors that accounted for the increase in employment in July 2006, the principal ones were business activities [NACE 74], construction [NACE 45] and manufacture of electronic components [NACE 32]. Sectors registering drops in employment included manufacture of textiles [NACE 17], collection and treatment of other waste [NACE 90] and manufacture of clothing [NACE 18].

With specific reference to the private sector, an increase in employment took place in business activities [NACE 74]. This includes architectural and engineering activities, advertising, security activities, industrial cleaning and call centres. In addition, growth in employment occurred in construction [NACE 45] and community, social and personal services activities [NACE 90-93]. The latter includes the gaming and betting activities. On the other hand, a fall in employment is taking place in clothing, textile and footwear manufacturing.

On its part, the public sector reported a decrease in employment in electricity, gas and water supply [NACE 40-41], public administration [NACE 75], and retail trade [NACE 52]. On the other hand, the public sector increased its staff complement in the areas of education [NACE 80] and health and social work [NACE 85].

Part-time Employment

According to administrative sources, total part-time employment rose by 2,929 persons between July 2005 and July 2006, as shown in Table 3. This increase occurred mainly on account of activity in the real estate, renting and business activities [NACE 70-74], wholesale and retail trade [NACE 50-52], and hotels and restaurants [NACE 55].

Apprentices, trainees and students

In July 2006, the number of apprentices, students and trainees dropped by 40.0 per cent. This can be seen in Table 1 ■

Methodological Notes

1. In line with international methodology, annual data are being presented as an average for each respective year.
2. The statistics in this release are based on the administrative records of the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC).
3. The data in this release are to be considered as current and therefore subject to revision. Monthly data are revised in T+12.
4. Full / part-time status is defined by what the employer (employer or self-employed) declares in the Engagement Form which is required to be sent to the ETC upon the commencement of employment.

Definitions

Part 1 of the unemployment register: Those registering under Part 1 are either new job seekers who have left school, re-entrants into the labour market, and job losers who have been made redundant by their former employer.

Part 2 of the unemployment register: Those registering under Part 2 are either workers who have been dismissed from work due to disciplinary action, left work out of their own free will, refused work or training opportunities or were struck off the register after an inspection by the Law Enforcement personnel.

Apprentices, trainees and students: Includes apprentices, trainees, Junior College and University students on the summer work-phase, undergraduate trainees, and trainees with fixed contracts.
