## Labour Market

### Gainfully Occupied Population: December 2006

*Administrative labour market data indicate that in December 2006, the full-time gainfully occupied population increased by 766 persons while unemployment decreased by 218 persons compared to the same month of 2005.*

Labour market data for December 2006 provided by the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC) indicate that the labour supply increased by 548 persons over the same month in the preceding year. The full-time gainfully occupied population increased by 766 persons, whereas the registered unemployed decreased by 218 persons.

### Full-time Employment

A comparison between the data for December 2005 and December 2006 indicates that, among the sectors that accounted for the increase in employment in December 2006, the principal ones were business activities [NACE 74], construction [NACE 45] and manufacture of electronic components [NACE 32]. Sectors registering drops in employment included transport, storage and communication [NACE 60-64], manufacture of textiles [NACE 17] and public administration [NACE 75].

With specific reference to the private sector, an increase in employment took place in real estate, renting and business activities [NACE 70-74]. This sector includes accounting and auditing activities, business and management consultancy, holding companies, architectural and engineering activities, advertising, security activities, industrial cleaning and call centres. In addition, growth in employment occurred in community, social and personal services activities [NACE 90-93]. This includes betting companies and entertainment activities among other services.

### Part-time Employment

According to administrative sources, total part-time employment rose by 3,475 persons between December 2005 and December 2006, as illustrated in Table 3. This increase included 1,488 persons whose part-time job is their secondary occupation and 1,987 persons whose part-time job is their primary occupation.

### Apprentices, trainees and students

In December 2006, the number of apprentices, students and trainees dropped by 19.1 per cent over the same month in the preceeding year as illustrated in Table 1 ■

## **Methodological Notes**

1. In line with international methodology, annual data are being presented as an average for each respective year.
2. The statistics in this release are based on the administrative records of the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC).
3. The data in this release are to be considered as current and therefore subject to revision. Monthly data are revised in T+12.
4. Full / part-time status is defined by what the employer (employer or self-employed) declares in the Engagement Form which is required to be sent to the ETC upon the commencement of employment.

## **Definitions**

**Part 1 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 1 are either new job seekers who have left school, re-entrants into the labour market, and job losers who have been made redundant by their former employer.

**Part 2 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 2 are either workers who have been dismissed from work due to disciplinary action, left work out of their own free will, refused work or training opportunities or were struck off the register after an inspection by the Law Enforcement personnel.

**Apprentices, trainees and students:** Includes apprentices, trainees, Junior College and University students on the summer work-phase, undergraduate trainees, and trainees with fixed contracts.

**Labour Supply:** The sum of the full-time gainfully occupied population and the registered unemployed population.

**Malta/Gozo employment:** Data on regional employment differs on the basis of economic sector. Accordingly, the data of the private sector depend on employee residence, whereas the data of the public sector depend on employer information of location of its employees.
