Labour Market

Gainfully Occupied Population: Revisions (2002-2006)

Revised labour market data indicate that in 2006, the full-time gainfully occupied population increased by 1,017 persons while unemployment decreased by 249 persons when compared to 2002.

This news release presents revisions of the labour market data provided by the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC). The time series presented in this release extends over a period of five years, that is from the year 2002 to 2006. The figures for the years 2002, 2003 and 2004 have been arrived at by working out the quarterly average for each year, while those for 2005 and 2006 were worked out on the basis of the monthly average for each respective year. In this commentary, the average data for 2006 is being compared with the average data for 2002. In 2006, the labour supply increased by 768 persons over the year 2002. The full-time gainfully occupied population increased by 1,017 persons, whereas the registered unemployed decreased by 249 persons.

Full-time Employment

A comparison between the average data for 2006 and 2002 indicates that the principal economic activities which have seen an increase in employment were business activities [NACE 74], education [NACE 80], wholesale trade [NACE 51] and retail trade [NACE 52]. Sectors registering drops in employment included manufacturing [NACE 15-37], construction [NACE 45], and transport, storage and communication [NACE 60-64].

With specific reference to the private sector, an increase in employment took place in real estate, renting and business activities [NACE 70-74]. This sector includes accounting and auditing activities, business and management consultancy, architectural and engineering activities, advertising, security activities, industrial cleaning and call centres. Wholesale, retail trade and repairs [NACE 50-52] and education [NACE 80] recorded an increase in employment as well. In addition, growth in employment also occurred in community, social and personal services activities [NACE 90-93]. This includes betting companies and entertainment activities among other services.

Part-time Employment

The average data for 2002 and 2006 indicate that total part-time employment rose by 11,044 persons in the four-year period. This increase included 4,397 persons whose part-time job is their secondary occupation and 6,647 persons whose part-time job is their primary occupation. As evident in Table 3, the major economic activities which reported the major increase in part-timers were retail trade [NACE 52] real estate, renting and business activities [NACE 70-74] and hotels and restaurants [NACE 55].

Apprentices, trainees and students

Upon comparing the figures for 2006 and 2002, it transpires that the number of apprentices, students and trainees dropped by 51.7 per cent as illustrated in Table 1.

April 2007

In April 2007, the full-time gainfully occupied population amounted to 139,526, while the number of registered unemployed persons stood at 6,748. Accordingly, the labour supply amounted to 146,274 ■

Methodological Notes

1. In line with international methodology, annual data are being presented as an average for each respective year.
2. The statistics in this release are based on the administrative records of the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC).
3. The data in this release are to be considered as current and therefore subject to revision. Monthly data are revised in T+12.
4. Full / part-time status is defined by what the employer (employer or self-employed) declares in the Engagement Form which is required to be sent to the ETC upon the commencement of employment.

Definitions

Part 1 of the unemployment register: Those registering under Part 1 are either new job seekers who have left school, re-entrants into the labour market, and job losers who have been made redundant by their former employer.

Part 2 of the unemployment register: Those registering under Part 2 are either workers who have been dismissed from work due to disciplinary action, left work out of their own free will, refused work or training opportunities or were struck off the register after an inspection by the Law Enforcement personnel.

Apprentices, trainees and students: Includes apprentices, trainees, Junior College and University students on the summer work-phase, undergraduate trainees, and trainees with fixed contracts.

Labour Supply: The sum of the full-time gainfully occupied population and the registered unemployed population.

Malta/Gozo employment: Data on regional employment differs on the basis of economic sector. Accordingly, the data of the private sector depend on employee residence, whereas the data of the public sector depend on employer information of location of its employees.
