## Labour Market

### Gainfully Occupied Population: January 2008

Labour market data for January 2008 indicate that the full-time gainfully occupied population increased by 3,295 persons while unemployment decreased by 845 persons when compared to January 2007.

This news release presents labour market data, provided by the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC), for the month of January 2008. In the month under review, the labour supply increased by 2,450 persons over the same month in 2007. The full-time gainfully occupied population increased by 3,295 persons, whereas the registered unemployed decreased by 845 persons.

In this way, the labour supply amounted to 149,899 persons. Of these, the full-time gainfully occupied population amounted to 143,436 persons, whilst the registered unemployed amounted to 6,463 persons.

### Economic activities

In the twelve-months to January 2008, the economic activities which registered the main growth in full-time employment were real estate, renting and business activities (NACE 70-74); other community, social and personal service activities (NACE 90-93); and hotels and restaurants (NACE 55). Accordingly, the sector of real estate, renting and business activities (NACE 70-74) increased 1,359 persons on its books. Among other activities, this sector includes accounting and auditing, security services and call centres. On its part, the sector of other community, social and personal service activities (NACE 90-93) increased by 869 persons. Besides other activities, this sector includes betting companies. Once again, hotels and restaurants (NACE 55) reported an increase of 564 persons, as illustrated in Table 1.

On the downside, the number of the gainfully occupied persons fell in manufacturing (NACE 15-37) and electricity, gas and water supply (NACE 40-41). In fact, manufacturing dropped 982 persons, whilst the sector of electricity, gas and water supply dropped 136 persons.

### Self-employment

On a year-on-year basis, the number of self-employed persons increased by 228 to reach 16,810 persons. The main economic activities in which the self-employed persons operate are wholesale and retail trade (NACE 50-52) and construction (NACE 45).

### Part-time employment

In the twelve months to January 2008, part-time employment rose by 2,919. Among part-timers who also hold a full-time job, there was an increase of 1,007 persons. Those having a part-time job as their primary occupation went up by 1,912 persons, as illustrated in Table 4 ■

## **Methodological Notes**

1. In line with international methodology, annual data are being presented as an average for each respective year.
2. The statistics in this release are based on the administrative records of the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC).
3. The data in this release are to be considered as current and therefore subject to revision. Monthly data are revised in T+12.
4. Full/part-time status is defined by what the employer (employer or self-employed) declares in the Engagement Form which is required to be sent to the ETC upon the commencement of employment.

## **Definitions**

**Part 1 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 1 are either new job seekers who have left school, re-entrants into the labour market, and job losers who have been made redundant by their former employer.

**Part 2 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 2 are either workers who have been dismissed from work due to disciplinary action, left work out of their own free will, refused work or training opportunities or were struck off the register after an inspection by the Law Enforcement personnel.

**Apprentices, trainees and students:** Includes apprentices, trainees, Junior College and University students in the summer work-phase, undergraduate trainees, and trainees with fixed contracts.

**Labour Supply:** The sum of the full-time gainfully occupied population and the registered unemployed population.

**Malta/Gozo employment:** Data on regional employment differ on the basis of economic sector. Accordingly, the data of the private sector depend on employee residence, whereas the data of the public sector depend on employer information of location of its employees.
