## Labour Market

### Gainfully Occupied Population: July 2008

*Labour market data for July 2008 indicate that the full-time gainfully occupied population increased by 3,574 persons while unemployment decreased by 374 persons when compared to July 2007.*

This news release presents labour market data provided by the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC) for July 2008. In the month under review, the labour supply increased by 3,200 persons over the corresponding month in 2007. The full-time gainfully occupied population increased by 3,574 persons, whereas the registered unemployed decreased by 374 persons.

In this way, the labour supply amounted to 152,075 persons. Of these, the full-time gainfully occupied population amounted to 146,117 persons, while the registered unemployed amounted to 5,958 persons.

On a year-on-year basis, the full-time gainfully occupied population in the public sector decreased by 495 persons. On the other hand, the full-time gainfully occupied population in the private sector increased by 4,069 persons. The main areas of the public sector which have shed jobs in the twelve months to July 2008 were transport, storage and communication (-548 persons), construction (-196 persons), and electricity, gas and water supply (-118 persons). In contrast, the main increase in the number of full-time gainfully occupied population within the public sector occurred in health and social work (NACE 85).

In the twelve months to July 2008, full-time employment increased by 3,179 in Malta and by 395 in Gozo.

### Economic activities

In the twelve months to July 2008, the economic activities which registered the main growth in full-time employment were real estate, renting and business activities (NACE 70-74); other community, social and personal service activities (NACE 90-93); and health and social work activities (NACE 85). Accordingly, the sector of real estate, renting and business activities (NACE 70-74) increased its employment by 1,291 persons. On its part, the sector of other community, social and personal service activities (NACE 90-93) gained 605 persons. Health and social work activities (NACE 85) reported an increase of 493 persons, as illustrated in Table 1.

On the downside, the number of the gainfully occupied persons fell in manufacturing (NACE 15-37) and electricity, gas and water supply (NACE 40-41). In fact, manufacturing dropped by 521 persons, while the sector of electricity, gas and water supply dropped by 120 persons.

### Self-employment

On a year-on-year basis, the number of self-employed persons increased by 184 to reach 17,013. The main economic activities in which self-employed persons operate were wholesale and retail trade (NACE 50-52) and construction (NACE 45).

### Part-time employment

In the twelve months to July 2008, part-time employment rose by 2,482. Among part-timers who also hold a full-time job, there was an increase of 959 persons, while those having a part-time job as their primary occupation went up by 1,523 persons, as illustrated in Table 4 ■

## Methodological Notes

1. In line with international methodology, annual data are being presented as an average for each respective year.
2. The statistics in this release are based on the administrative records of the Employment and Training Corporation (ETC).
3. The data in this release are to be considered as current and therefore subject to revision. Monthly data are revised in T+12.
4. Full/part-time status is defined by what the employer (employer or self-employed) declares in the Engagement Form which is required to be sent to the ETC upon the commencement of employment.

## Definitions

**Part 1 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 1 are either new job seekers who have left school, re-entrants into the labour market, and job losers who have been made redundant by their former employer.

**Part 2 of the unemployment register:** Those registering under Part 2 are either workers who have been dismissed from work due to disciplinary action, left work out of their own free will, refused work or training opportunities or were struck off the register after an inspection by the Law Enforcement personnel.

**Apprentices, trainees and students:** Includes apprentices, trainees, Junior College and University students in the summer work-phase, undergraduate trainees, and trainees with fixed contracts.

**Labour Supply:** The sum of the full-time gainfully occupied population and the registered unemployed population.

**Malta/Gozo employment:** Data on regional employment differ on the basis of economic sector. Accordingly, the data of the private sector depend on employee residence, whereas the data of the public sector depend on employer information of location of its employees.
